


IN THE BEGINNING ...

It was on Sept. 16, 1992 that 12 people met in the basement of Paul and Lou Hutchens' Yadkinville home for a prayer meeting, a group that also included Phillip Graham, Jim and Una Graham, Joyce Hamby, Lynn Winters, John and Ima Paulson, Martha Graham, Vera Poindexter and Ruth Crater. Nothing was quite official at the moment, nothing was cast in stone. All that was certain was that the group had a desire to honor their Lord.

On Nov. 29, 1992, the first "official" worship service of what is today Maplewood Baptist Church was held at Ace's Restaurant. Rev. Larry Daniels, a Friend's minister, spoke. The offering taken that day came to \$527.10.

"This was a major step for us," wrote Ima Paulson in her notes on the history of the church. "We all felt uplifted. It was a great day for us all. Someone from the youth supplied us with a keyboard for our music."

A week later, services were moved to the Yadkin Baptist Association building and would remain there for more than two years, while the church's new building was under construction. Shortly after moving to the association's building, Fred Reece, who'd retired from Green Street Baptist Church in High Point, came on board as a supply minister.

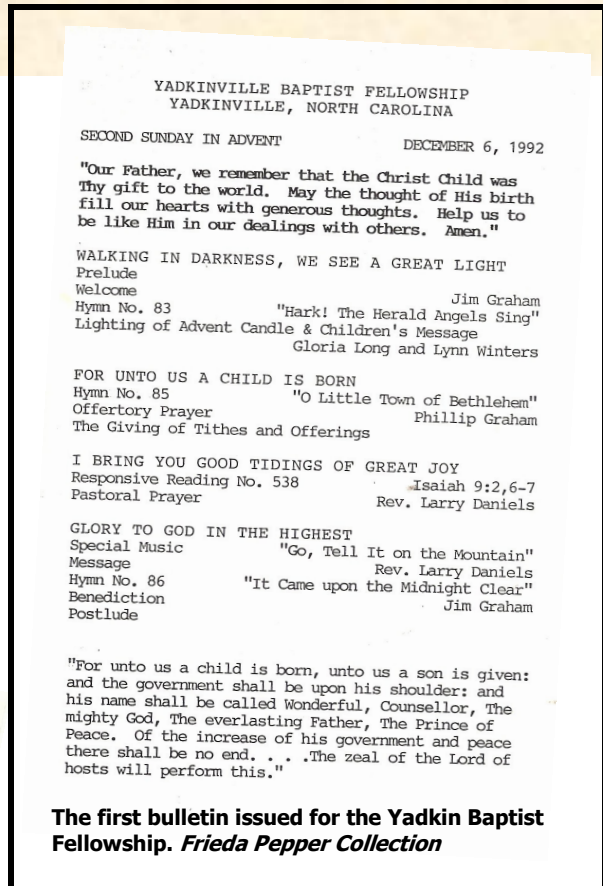
DID YOU KNOW?

*Before our church was even named, it had a budget. Weekly offering came to \$700, with an estimated yearly budget of \$36,400.

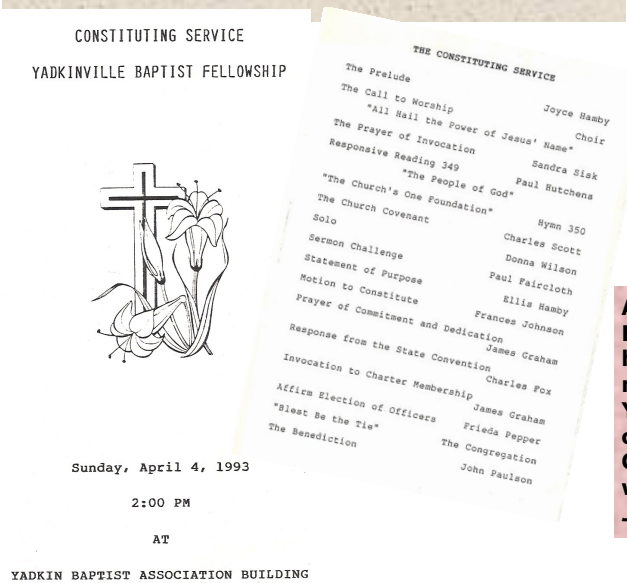
*The first business meeting of the new church was held Dec. 8, 1992 at the home of Paul and Lou Hutchens. During that meeting, it was agreed that the congregation would temporarily go by the name Yadkin Baptist Fellowship, following a motion by Phillip Graham. It was also decided that Joyce Hamby would be hired as a part-time secretary, a position she still holds. The meeting was closed by Lou reading Psalms 64.

*Fred Pepper was the first person baptized as a member of the church. It took place on April 18, 1993 at Bear Creek Church.

*The top 10 names for the church were voted on during an Aug. 15, 1993 meeting. Maplewood Baptist Church was announced as the winner three days later. Other names considered were Calvary Knoll, Rolling Hills and United Believers.

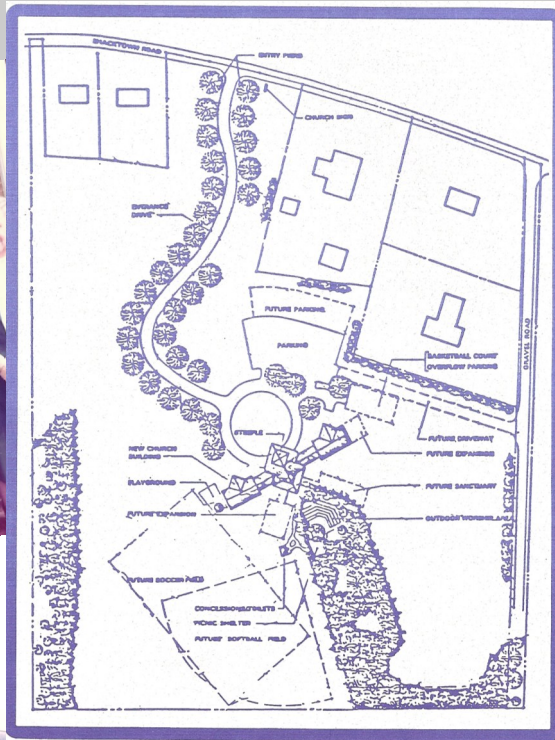


The first bulletin issued for the Yadkin Baptist Fellowship. *Frieda Pepper Collection*



A decision to constitute the new church was made on Feb. 10, 1993. On April 4, the constituting service was held at the Yadkin Baptist Association building, with representatives from the North Carolina Baptist and Yadkin Baptist Associations people initially joined as charter members (At left is a program from the service). Charter membership was kept open until June 6, 1993, when a total of 55 people had signed up. *Frances Johnson Collection*

The people were there, but the meeting place was only temporary. Members of the church voted on July 18, 1993 to purchase a tract of nearly 17 acres on Shacktown Road. A Challenge to Build fundraising program began with a another vote on Jan. 26, 1994. Shown below left are members of the program's steering committee. Two months later, church members voted again to accept a master site plan (below right). The plan called for a tree-lined driveway, outdoor worship area and also provided for expansion. *Frances Johnson Collection*

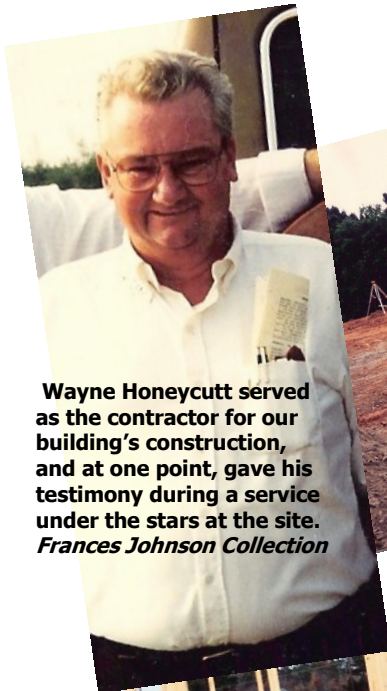

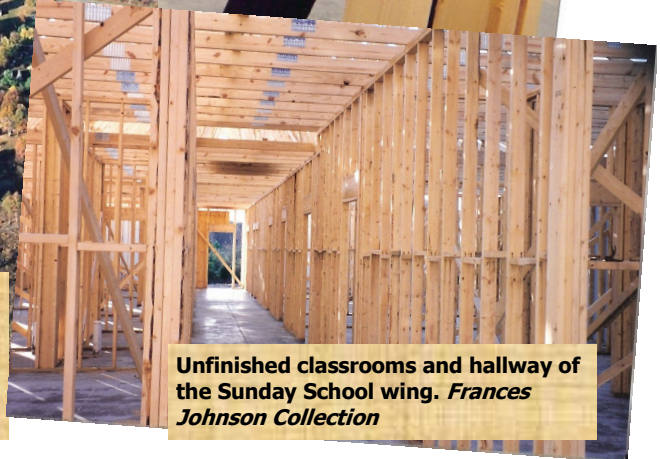

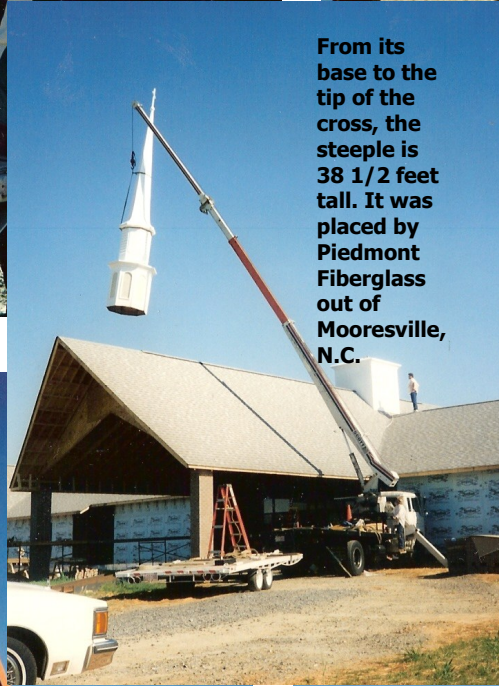

From its base to the tip of the cross, the steeple is 38 1/2 feet tall. It was placed by Piedmont Fiberglass out of Mooresville, N.C.



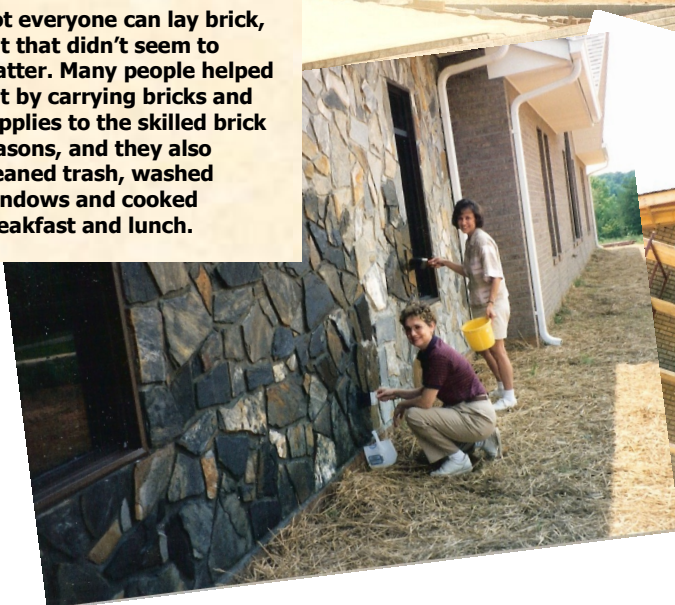

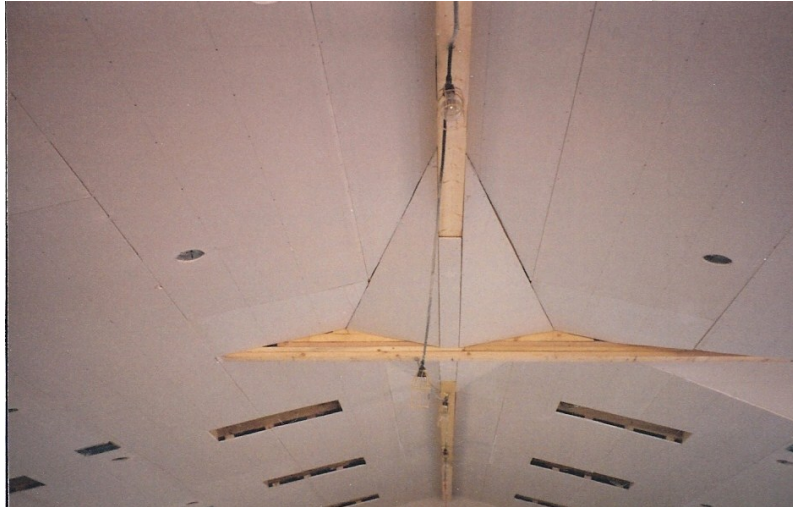

FREDDIE BRASWELL

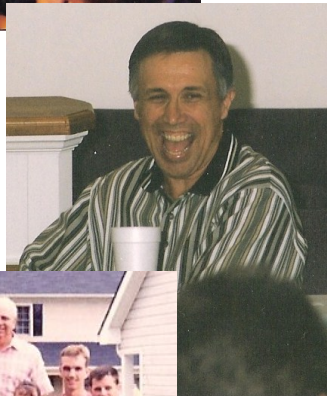

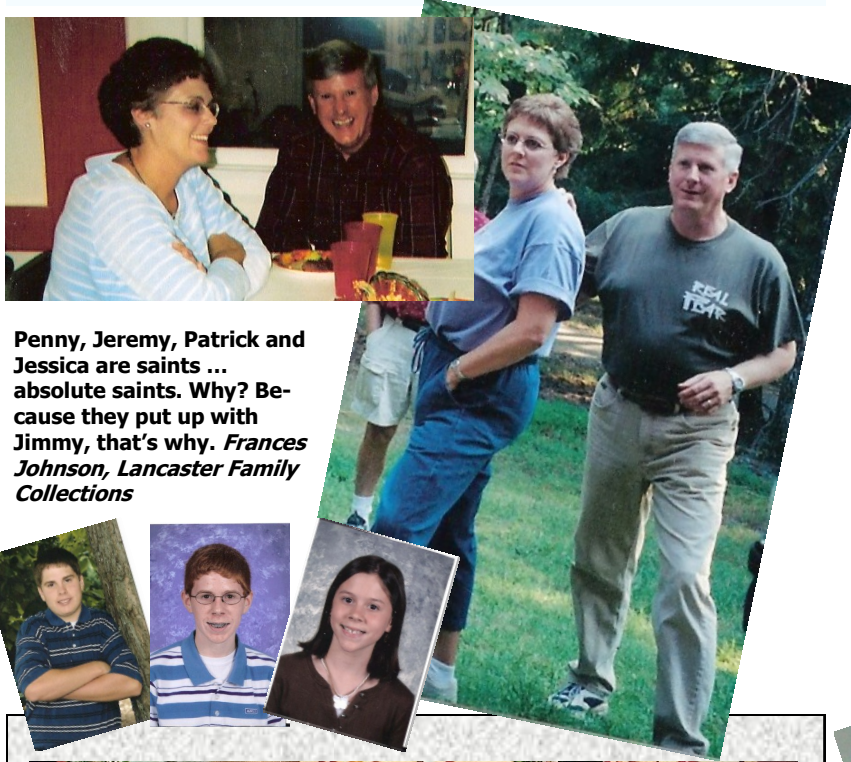

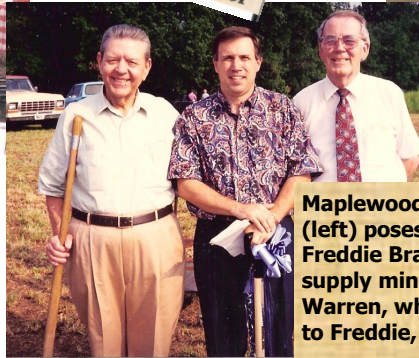

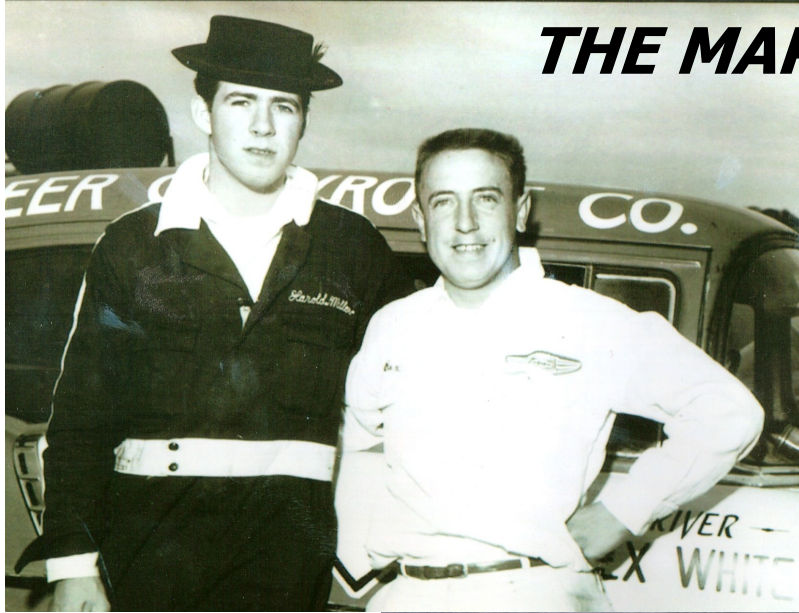

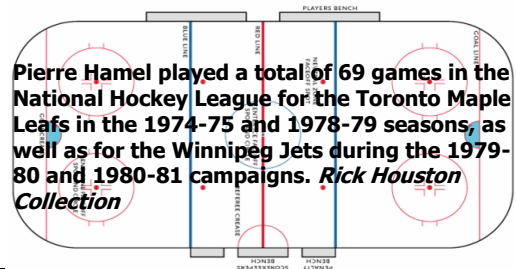

Tom became friends with Carl Sandburg after taking part in Murrow's interview with the famed poet. He was there as Murrow locked horns with Sen. Joseph McCarthy, a confrontation highlighted by the recent movie *Good Night, And Good Luck*. He's flown on Air Force One with four different U.S. Presidents — Johnson, Nixon, Ford and Carter. He helped put news of John F. Kennedy's assassination on the air.

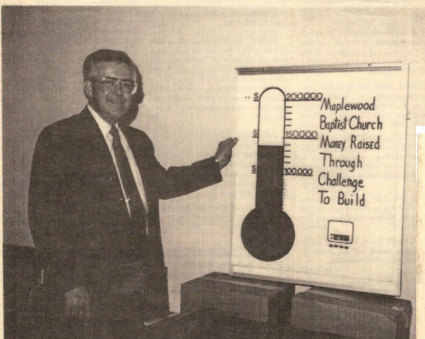

Dedication Of New Church Will Be Sunday

The congregation of Maplewood Baptist Church of Yadkinville wishes to extend a special invitation to the community to attend the dedication service of its new building on Sunday, Aug. 13 at 3 p.m. The service will mark the completion of the church's educational and worship facility located on Maplewood Drive, off Shacktown Road just outside Yadkinville city limits. Members attended their first service in the beautiful new facility in mid-July after six months of anticipation and hard work. Construction of the 2000-square-foot brick and rock structure began last October. Members hired a few professionals to supervise but most of the work was done by volunteers from churches around the state and by friends in the community -- and by members. Pastor Freddie Braswell stated, "It was a real team effort, we asked and they came." The educational wing houses Sunday School room, a beautifully decorated children's area with a nursery, pastor's study, church office, parlor/bride's room, and a large conference room. A glass narthex leads to the worship area which seats over 200 people. A large circular stained glass window centers the cathedral ceiling hangs a six-foot cross of solid oak, a reminder of the ultimate office the Lord Jesus Christ, his people. The cross also serves as a reminder that through faith all things are possible. The new facility is situated on 10 acres of land with enough allow for additional built-in parking and a ball field. Paving of the drive and parking lots is scheduled for September. 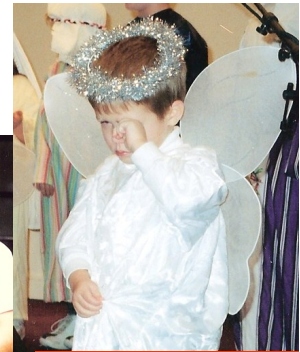

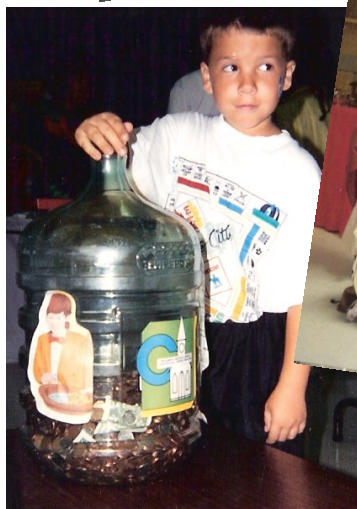
